Dear friends and families,

This letter serves to ensure you are informed of the COVID status in our facility. This information is very fluid and could change at any time. As always, we will keep you informed as new information is received.

Facility COVID positive numbers are noted in the table below. These positive cases were communicated to staff and our resident's primary contacts within 24 hours of identified cases, via our one-call phone notification system.

| 0 | COVID-19 DEATHS: Residents with suspected or laboratory positive COVID-19 who died in the facility or another location. |

Current Testing and Isolation- The above positive employees had provided care to residents in the 300 and 400 units during a time in which they did not have symptoms but may have been contagious. Residents on these units were tested, identifying two positive residents, one on 300 and one on 400. Residents with an active COVID diagnosis will remain on isolation for 10 days from their positive test date (note the test date is day 0). We will continue testing per guidelines until no new cases are identified.

County Positivity Rates- Our county positivity rate is 9.99% according to the CDC website on 6/10/22. While this is a decrease from last week's positivity rate, the transmission risk continues to be noted as high. Please be aware of the high transmission risk and the risk this poses to you. We recommend wearing a mask in public spaces, avoiding large gatherings, washing your hands frequently, and consider getting the vaccine or boosters if you are eligible.

Visitation- We ask that you please refrain from visiting even if you have minor symptoms such as a runny nose or sore throat. According to the CDC, people exhibiting these symptoms are testing positive for COVID. All visitors are required to follow the COVID infection control guidelines posted throughout our facility. These expectations include completing the COVID questions on our Accu-Shield system at the front desk. Our questions on the system have changed, so please read and respond to them correctly. If you answer yes to any of the symptom, exposure, or pending test questions, you are NOT permitted to visit for the protection of our residents and staff.

Vaccines and Boosters- CDC is strongly encouraging a second booster be provided to those over 50. We are providing booster clinics at our facility on a routine basis and are asking that you be open to allowing your loved one to receive the second booster, if you haven't already. We are finding that, while our residents and staff may still contract the virus, despite vaccination, being up to date with the vaccine is preventing serious illness.

We continue to follow guidance from the CDC, Department of Health, and CMS. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation with our masking, screening and social distancing protocols for our facility. Our utmost priority is to protect the residents, staff, and their families. If you have any questions, please let us know.
